CSR Progress Report for the period April 2023 to March 2024

I. Eradicating hunger, poverty, and malnutrition.

Promoting preventive health care & sanitation, making available safe drinking water

Safe and sufficient water facilitates the practice of hygiene, which is a key measure to prevent not only diarrheal diseases, but acute respiratory infections and numerous neglected tropical diseases. The health burden of poor water quality is enormous. It is estimated that around 37.7 million Indians are affected by waterborne diseases annually.



Hence, to provide safe drinking water for the villagers, we are running 2 RO plants in 2 villages. Distributed purified water from nine RO plants from April 2023 to March 2024.

Health camps

1) Jaipur foot camp

The life of a person with a disability is not an easy one. Their disability has an impact on everyone around them, affecting both the individual and their family. People with disabilities need more special healthcare than people without disabilities.

Hence, to help physically challenge people to lead a normal life with social dignity and respect, with the association of Bhagwan Mahavir Vikalang Sahayata Samiti Jaipur, we have conducted a Jaipur foot (artificial limb fitment) camp from July 26th to July 28th, 2023, at Sahakari Kalyana Mantapa Hospet.

Shri Shridhar Pabbaraju – VP Marketing, inaugurated the camp. The physically challenged people from Vijayanagara, Bellary, Koppal, and other districts benefited from the camp.





149 people received artificial limbs, 29 people received calipers, 7 people received crutches and 1 woman got an artificial hand. 186 physically challenged people benefited from the Jaipur foot camp. During the program, Shri H K Ramesh, VP CSR, Shri Anil Surana and technicians from Bhagwan Mahavir Vikalang Sahayata Samiti, Smt Veena Jain from Helping Hands, and others were present.

2) Eye screening & surgery camps

Glaucoma is recognized as one of the leading causes of irreversible blindness across the world. Ophthalmic care for glaucoma is limited in rural areas due the eye care facilities are inadequate, the treatment costs may not be affordable, awareness about the nature of the disease is low. Thus, a majority of the patients remain undiagnosed.

To address the above challenges and to diagnose the eye problems of the villagers, in association with Ashwini Eye Hospital and Netralakshmi Vaidyalaya Hospet, we have conducted eye screening camps in Kanivihalli and Jaisingpura villages. 145 villagers were screened, 65 villagers were referred for surgery, and 37 people underwent cataract surgery.





Dr. Shrinivas Deshpande and Dr. Vidyashree visited the village, screened the patients, and created awareness on refractive errors, the importance of diagnosis and treatment, and the management of various eye health diseases among the villagers.

3. Health camps

Most communicable diseases are preventable. Life style diseases (diabetes, hypertension, high cholesterol, stroke) are also on the rise even in rural areas. These diseases, collectively known as non-communicable diseases, are important causes of premature death in the young and middle aged.





Hence, to create awareness about health and sanitation among the villagers through providing basic medical facilities, we have conducted 5 health camps in 2 villages. 371 villagers benefited from the health camps.

4. WASH program in Schools



Promoting WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) in Indian schools is a vital initiative aimed at fostering a culture of cleanliness and health among the students. Prioritize on handwashing is a crucial hygiene habit, equipping children with a powerful tool against diseases.

Hence, to reduce the infection risk,

improve attendance, academic performance, and promote a healthy lifestyle for children,

we have conducted 2 WASH programs in schools in Jaisingpura village. 50 kids/students benefited from WASH programs.

5. Support for Samarpan project – Mumbai.



Samarpan, as an organization, operates an outpatient facility in Mumbai, and a residential facility in Mulshi, Pune. Samarpan opened its residential facility for admissions on March 26, 2022. Samarpan's primary treatment program is a minimum 28-day inpatient stay, with an additional two months of continuing care post discharge. Often, clients benefit

from longer stays in treatment, and outcome studies indicate that longer episodes of primary treatment, produce better outcome goals.

The rehab environment is crucial for clients, in that it provides an environment that is conducive to client comfort, in a non-clinical setting. Research has shown that comfortable and pleasant environments improve client engagement, breakdown barriers between therapy staff and clients, and also allow clients to feel comfortable when they are emotionally uncomfortable.

Samarpan provides evidence-based treatment interventions, including a proven integrated treatment program, delivered and monitored by experienced therapists with substance abuse backgrounds and supported by highly qualified healthcare professionals.

6. Construction of household toilets.

Sanitation is one of the most complicated problems in India that remains unresolved despite many efforts by the government. Lack of public/private toilets, proper drainage facilities, solid waste management, and public hygiene are major areas of concern.



Hence, to create awareness about sanitation and reduce infectious diseases such as cholera, typhoid, and dysentery in rural India, we have supported five families to construct toilets at Jaisingpura village in Sandura taluka.

I. Promoting education, including special education and employment enhancing vocational skills.

1. Special classes for rural 10th standard students.



Education opens up new opportunities to access new information and technology that enables an individual to make the right decisions in both personal and professional life. Hence, in an effort to help the rural 10th standard students stand out in the board exam and come out with the best result, we have conducted special tuition classes at Kanivihalli village, Wind Farm Area of

Harapanahalli taluka.

We have been conducting these special classes for students for 10 years in the subjects of mathematics, English and science. This has been helpful a lot to the students who cannot travel to cities and also to the students who cannot afford tuition fees. 30 students benefited from the special classes.

2. Scholarship for girl student's education.

Education is a fundamental right for every individual, regardless of gender. However, in India, girls have long been denied this right due to societal norms and prejudices. Education empowers girls, leading to better health, economic growth, and reduced poverty rates.

Hence, to promote girls' education in rural areas, we have supported rural girls through the scholarship program. 22 girls benefited from 2 villages.

3. Establishment of public library at Jaisingpura village





Public library is the center of information which provides services to its readers on the basis of equality of access for all, regardless of age, race, sex, religion, language or social status. Public libraries are essential since they improve literacy, stimulate imagination and expand personal horizons.

To provide free access to books, magazines, newspapers, journals, and other resources that promote literacy, learning, and personal growth among the villagers, we have established a public library at Jaisingpura village in Sandur taluka.

4. Development of garden at Central library, Hospet.

Public libraries are essential since they improve literacy, stimulate imagination and expand personal horizons. They also inform and empower citizens, enable access to a common cultural heritage and support education at all levels.







5. Furniture distribution for School

Education is a significant tool that aids in the creation of a well-developed and progressive nation. Especially in a developing country like India with a population of more than 136 crores, education is the key to a better standard of living and a prosperous future.

To enhance the infrastructure facilities of the Government school, we have



distributed basic furniture to the Government Higher Primary School – Kanivihalli village. 299 students benefited from this program.

6. Support for transportation (bus pass) for rural students at Jaisingpura village



Education is a fundamental human right, and it is the key to economic and social development. Despite its importance, the quality of education in rural areas of India has been a concern for several decades. Many children in rural areas face challenges such as poverty, lack of infrastructure, inadequate teacher training, and limited access to quality education.

To support rural, needy students accessing education, we have supported students of Jaisingpura village for their transportation facilities by providing annual bus pass charges.

37 students from Jaisingpura village traveling to Hospet, Sandur and Koppal every day to attend their schools and colleges and benefited from this program. During the event, village leaders and CSR staff were present.

Skill training programs

1. Tailoring training program for rural unemployed women.



In India, rural women make a major contribution to human survival, but are, still, among the most deprived, ignored and exploited people. Access to education and training can make major impact on their potential to avail and benefit from incomegenerating opportunities and improve their overall well-being.

Therefore, in an effort to create better livelihood opportunities for rural women, we have started new batches of tailoring training programs at D.Mallapura and Jaisingpura villages Sandur taluka. 65 women enrolled for the training program.

2. Embroidery training program:

Vocational Training program aim to provide skills and confidence to women from economically backward families and help them to achieve economic and social independence

In an effort to empower the women through skill training program, we have organized and successfully completed embroidery training program at Jaisingpura village in Sandur taluka. 20 women benefited from the training.



Ensuring environmental sustainability, ecological balance, protection of flora & fauna.

1. Avenue plantation with tree guards.



Trees are essentially human and other living organisms' livestock. They have unconditionally provided us with food, oxygen, and a variety of other necessities for human survival, such as shelter, medicines, tools, and so on.

To create awareness about plantation among the public and as a part of the Hospet Green project, during the period, we planted 4,085

plants at different locations in Hospet city.

2. Plantation in Schools.

As a part of the Vanamahotsav program, with the association of the Forest Department, Education Department, and Schools, we have initiated a plantation program in schools in Hospet taluka by planting saplings at school premises. We have planted 1,119 plants in 29 schools' premises.

3. Soil and water conservation: Construction of check dam at Jaisingpura village.



Among the artificial rain water harvesting mechanisms, check dams have received considerable importance in India as well as the other countries. Check dams are small barriers built across the direction of water flow such as channel, stream, nala, etc., to capture the rain water.

Hence, to enhance the ground water level and enable stored monsoon water for agriculture

purpose, we have constructed 2 check dams at Jaisingpura village of Sandur taluka. Check dams hold water during the rainy season in a catchment area. The water held back percolates into the ground and replenishes the nearby water table and water wells. Excess trapped water can be used over a period of time for irrigation and domestic needs.

Promoting gender equality, empower women

1. Self Help Groups (SHGs)



Women are a vital part of the Indian Economy, both at the national and the household levels. Self Help Groups (SHG) approach has become the most sought after means for achieving that goal of women empowerment. SHGs provides with easy credit & financial assistance & have contributed to the upliftment of women to a great extent in rural areas.

To empower rural women economically and socially, we are running 29 Self Helps Groups in 19 villages. The SHGs helped to create livelihood opportunities for 389 rural families. Self-Help Groups (SHGs) are small groups of poor people that come together to help each other. SHG's members confront similar challenges. They assist one another in resolving their issues. SHGs encourage their members to save tiny amounts of money. The money is deposited in the bank. In the name of the SHG, this is the common fund. The SHG uses its common funds to lend its members easy instalments with a low rate of interest.

2. Training for SHG members

We have conducted 9 trainings for SHG members on group concept, common fund management, income generation activities, linkage, and networking with other institutions. 92 SHG members benefited from training.



3. Book writer training for SHG members

We have conducted 5 book writers trainings on writing meeting minutes, general ledgers, cash books, and individual savings loan ledgers. 22 SHG book writers benefited from the training.

4. Village level meeting:

We have conducted village level meeting for SHG members at Jaisingpura village. We discussed the challenges faced by the SHG members related to running SHGs, the implementation of income generation activities, and educating members to avail themselves of government schemes. 23 SHG members participated in village level meetings.



5. Support for house construction at Jaisingpura

We supported 2 families for house construction at Jaisingpura village of Sandura taluka.

6. Engaged the Community Resource Person (CRP)

To monitor Self Help Groups (SHGs) at Kanivihalli & Srungarathota villages – Wind Farm area of Harapanahalli taluka, we have engaged one Community Resource Person (CRP).

The CRP will monitor and strengthen the SHGs and support us in implementing the other need-based CSR activities in 2 villages.



7. Support for SHGs through revolving fund

To start income generation/socio economic development activities, we supported 2 SHGs through revolving fund of Rs 1,10,000/-

Support for Sutr Santati program.

The Sutr Santati project is implemented through Abheraj Baldota Foundation by organizing textiles exhibitions at Mumbai and Chennai. The exhibitions represent traditional Indian textiles specifically designed to foster Indian pride using traditional techniques and indigenous natural yarns.

Through appropriate design, engagements and innovation, 'Sutr Santati seeks to steer Indian textiles towards becoming relevant for the future and aspirational for the world, thus keeping this very important industry thriving.



Promotion of rural sports

1. Support for sports



Sports have always held significant importance in the cultural tapestry of India. From traditional games played in rural villages to the modern sports arenas that grace cities, the evolution of India's sports landscape speaks volumes about its historical significance and the nation's pursuit of excellence.

Hence, to promote rural sports and to support talented rural athletes, we have supported for cricket tournament at Kanivihalli village. 330 rural athletes benefited and participated in tournament.

Rural development projects

1. Generator for community hall at Hospet.

Community halls play a very significant role in the social life of all communities. They act as a shared resource that serves the public by organizing their events at no cost, which reduces their financial burden.

Hence, to supply continuous electricity to public events, we have installed a generator for the community hall at Hospet.



5. Maintenance of Parks

The RMML continuously strives to promote health, wellness, and a good environment in the surrounding areas of its operations. To achieve this objective, we have developed Baldota park and maintained in Hospet City.

The park has been redeveloped and provided facilities like a walking path, play equipment, separate play equipment for different age groups of children, a place for yoga, gym equipment to maintain fitness, a separate place for senior citizens to do their recreation, illumination of the park for late-night users, a plantation to create greenery, a stage to have a small public program, etc. Every day, more than 200 people visit this park. We have replaced and installed a new pump set at Baldota Park.

2. Installation of benches at Kalyana nagar, Hospet.

The senior citizens and women from Kalyana Nagara, Sai Ram Layout, and Chittawadigi are using the public park for walking, exercise and recreational activities in their area. But there are no benches to take rest, hence, we have installed 6 benches at the park, which helps them to sit and to take rest.



Other rural development projects.

Provided 50 LED bulbs for street lights for Jaisingpura village.
